↔ House Rules ↔

The Australian Bakery welcomes all acoustic musicians to our Tuesday and Friday Bluegrass jams. We have specific rules which must be followed by all participants and spectators for the enjoyment and safety all. Persons who do not follow these rules are subject to temporary or permanent banning from the jam at the sole discretion of the management.

- No physical altercations will be tolerated. Anyone who engages in a fight with any other musician or spectator will be permanently banned from the premises.
- Our distinctly Southern music calls for Southern courtesy toward fellow musicians and the public.
- Alcohol shall not be brought into the store. Alcohol shall not be brought to or consumed on the sidewalk in front of the store.
- Be conscious of our customers and the passing public even if you are “in the zone” musically. Our store is open for business during the jam. Musicians must give way to customers access through the store. Likewise, the public has the right-of-way on the sidewalk and musicians shall give way. We are WRONG if anyone walks in the street to by-pass the crowd.
- Tightly stack cases in such a way (under tables/against walls) as to avoid trip hazards, and do not block tables tops with your case.
- Return chairs to where you found them.
- Clean up your beverage debris when you leave for the night.
- Familiarize yourself with the “Introduction to Bluegrass Jamming” document by Tom Barnwell and “Jam Etiquette” by Bart Veerman. Compliance will greatly improve your enjoyment of, and acceptance into any jam. Both are available here for your perusal and linked on our website.
